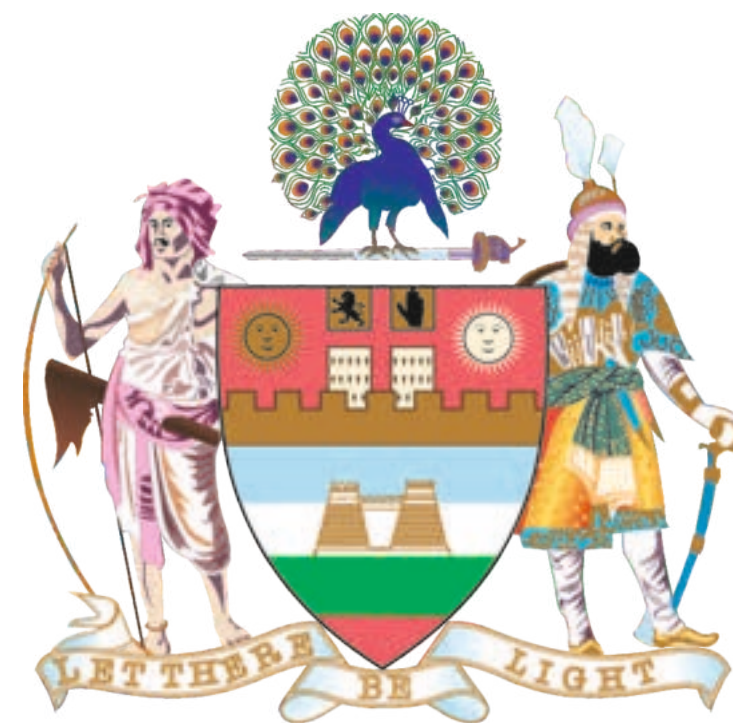
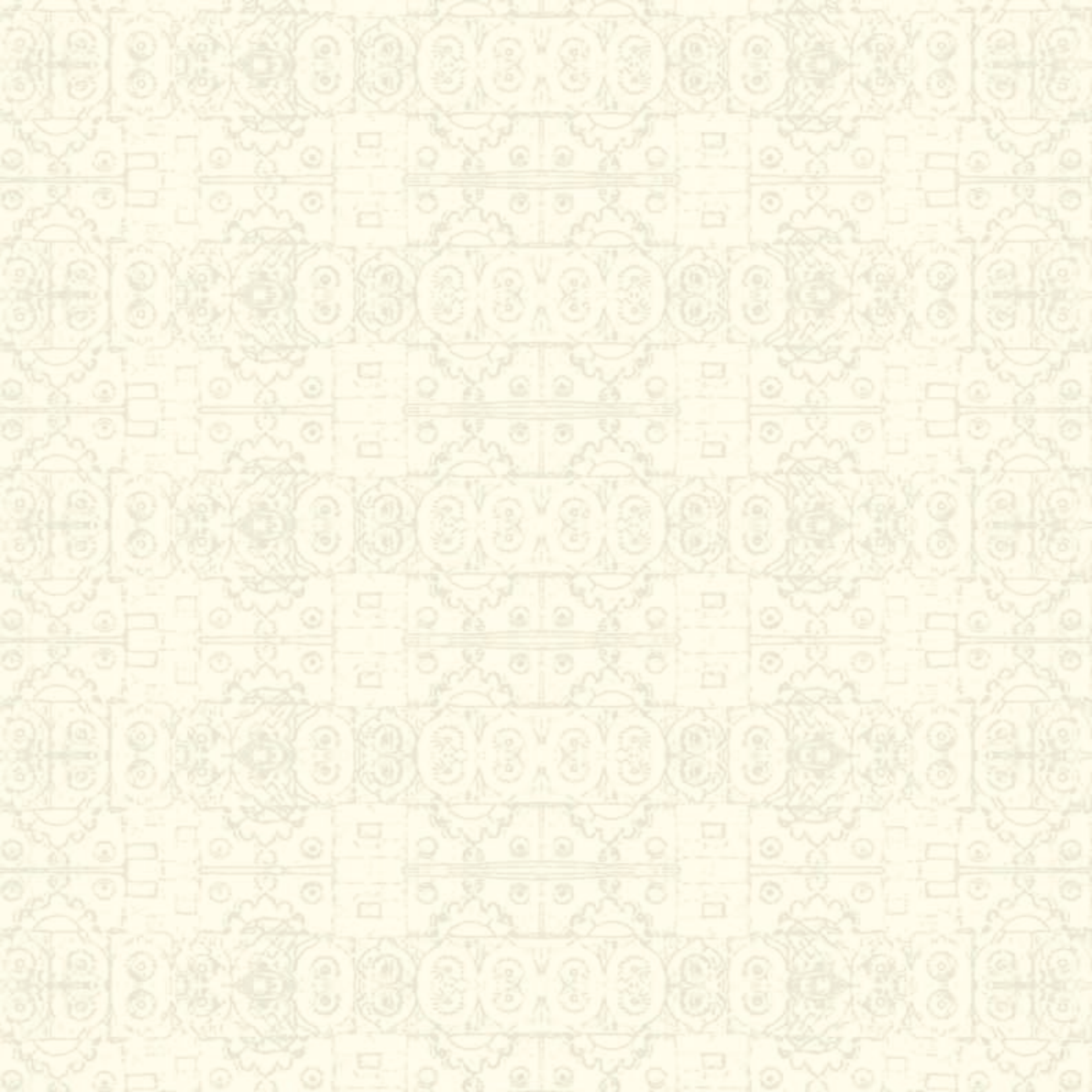

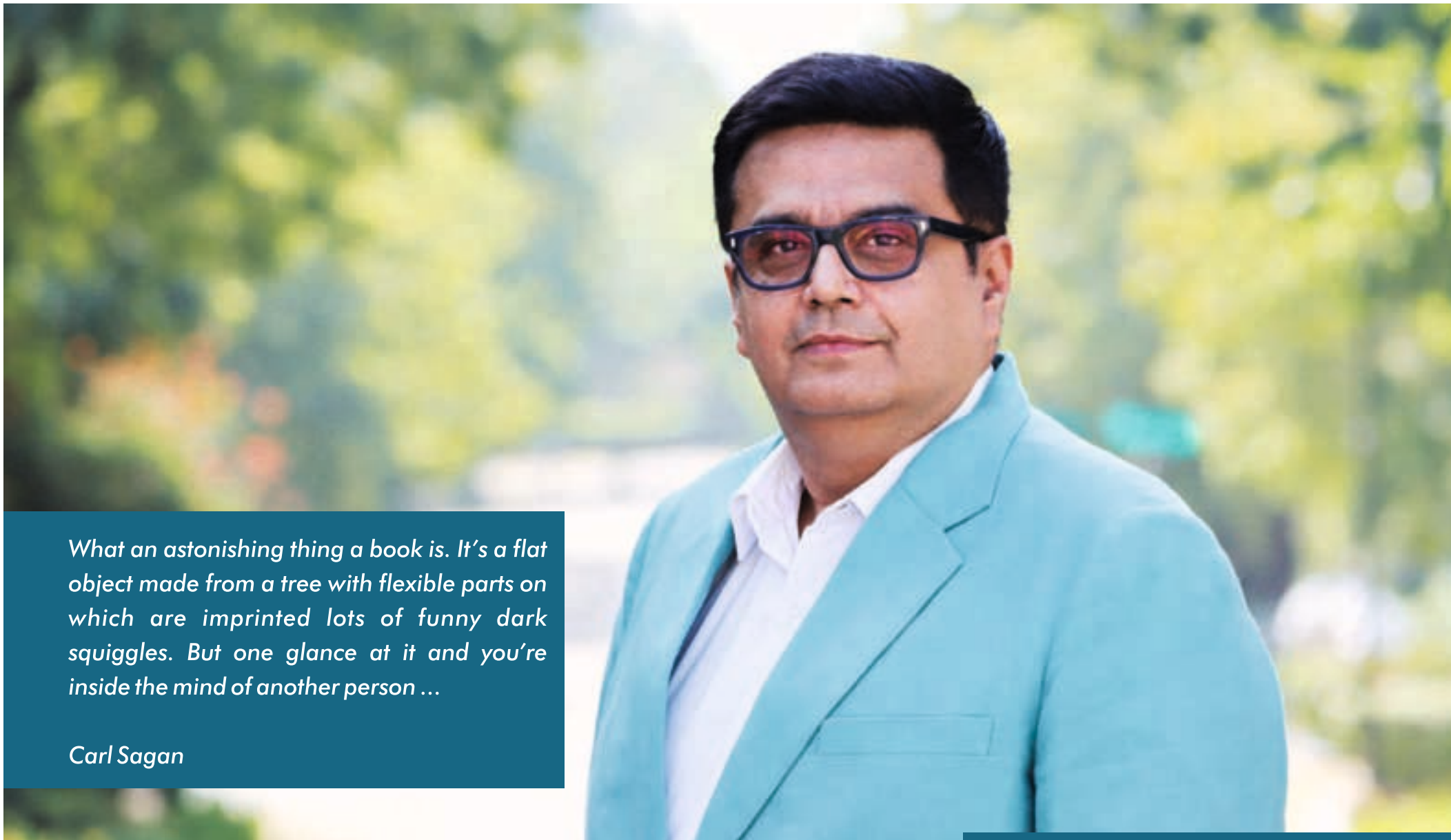

HH Maharaja Gaj Singh Ji of Jodhpur — President MCGC

Our chief guest for the day, Mr Deep Kapuria, Your Highnesses, members of the General Council, old boys, former teachers of Mayo College, Director Mayo College, Lt. Gen. Kulkarni, staff of the school, parents, and dear students, it gives me immense pleasure to welcome you all today for the Prize Giving Function. I extend my heartfelt congratulations to all those who have put in such elaborate and complex efforts to make this day—and these few days—enjoyable and pleasant. The play was an absolute triumph, and the musical extravaganza was out of this world, creating a great moment of happiness and togetherness, bringing us all closer in a strong bond.

I would also like to thank the parents and guardians for being present in such large numbers to encourage their wards, and I congratulate all the award recipients, both those receiving prizes today and those recognized at yesterday's sports events.

At the outset, I wish to record my admiration for the visionary leadership and steadfast mentoring provided by my predecessor, the late His Highness Maharaja Brijraj Singh of Kotah. His contributions will always be remembered in the annals of Mayo.

Apart from being a Mayo Old Boy, he was a representative of the Old Boys



on the Board, serving as Vice President and President over several terms. Nearly his entire life was connected with Mayo, and we miss him dearly.

We have completed a 360-degree review of our institutions and are now implementing an integrated, synergized approach called "One Mayo." This will help us complement the strengths of our schools while allowing them to retain their unique identities. The changes we have set in motion should bode well for the future.

Now, turning to the present, I witness a deepening of our strong alumni connections. I can see so many Old Boys and their families in the audience, which is a testament to their unwavering love for their alma mater. It gives me great pleasure and pride to note that the Diamond Jubilee batch of 1963 is well represented here, as well as the Golden Jubilee, Silver Jubilee, and several other batches. I welcome you all and look forward to your continued engagement with Mayo College. Your support from time to time is invaluable.

Let me now introduce our chief guest, Mr. Deep Kapuria, whom I met recently in Jodhpur. I was deeply impressed by his passion for Mayo College education, as well as his work in IT and Robotics. We are delighted to have him among us at this special moment. Mr. Kapuria is a prominent and successful Mayoite. He joined Mayo in 1958 with a Government of India merit scholarship—though few knew it at the time. He won many academic prizes each year and graduated at the top of his batch in 1966, earning a

place on the Board Merit List.

During his time at Mayo, he received accolades such as the Pandit Shiv Narayan Gold Medal for Sanskrit, the Geejgarh Geeta Prize, the Duke of Edinburgh Silver Award, and the Award of Merit for Life Saving. He also served as a school monitor in 1965-66 and will always be remembered for his contributions.

After graduating in 1966, Mr Kapuria joined BITS Pilani for his engineering degree and later went on to Harvard Business School in the USA. Following specialized training in manufacturing and design technology in Germany, Japan, and the USA, Mr Kapuria ventured out on his own with a modest capital of just two lakhs. Today, he is the founding chairman of the High-Tech Group, a business with an annual turnover of over 250,000 million. The group spans a wide spectrum of products and services, including the manufacturing of sophisticated powertrain components, sub-systems, and cutting-edge technology in robotics, artificial intelligence, vision embedded systems, and autonomous vehicle technologies.

In 2019, Mr Kapuria visited Mayo College as an Old Boy. After interacting with our students, he was exhilarated by their curiosity and concerns about their future and AI. This led to the idea of setting up a human-centric Centre of Excellence on Robotics and AI at Mayo College, aimed at inspiring students to familiarize themselves with these technologies. Mr Kapuria and his High-Tech Group of companies generously contributed 55 lakhs for the construction of this new

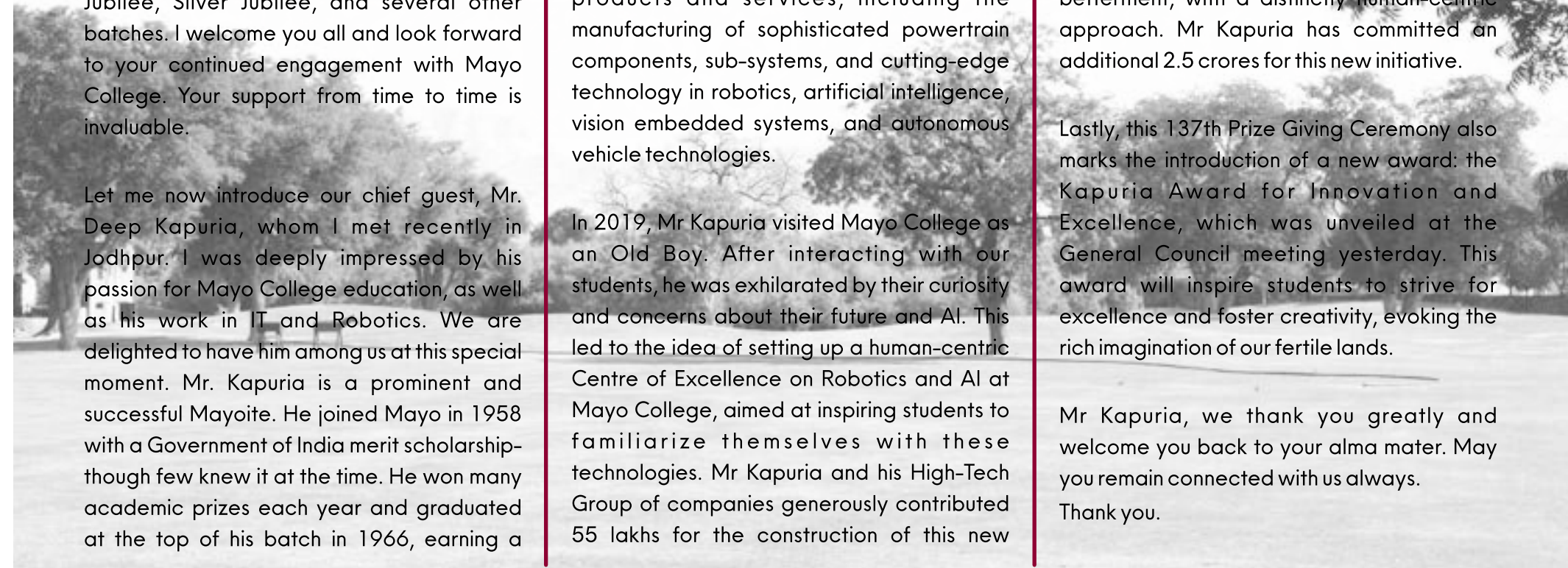
Centre, which now offers robotics education for students from Class 4 to 12. This phase of excellence was completed in 2023.

In early 2023, Mr Kapuria envisioned an upgrade for the Centre of Excellence by introducing advanced AI modules. This led to the addition of three new AI zones: Computer Vision, Real-Time Image and Text Processing, Metaverse Computer Vision and Image Processing. These zones are already operational and will soon be incorporated into the robotics and AI curriculum. For this next phase, a budget of 50 lakhs was planned, with an additional commitment of 31 lakhs in sponsorship from Mr Kapuria.

Taking this endeavour to the next level, Mr. Kapuria envisions a world-class Robotics and AI Centre of Excellence called "K Infinity." This advanced centre will focus not only on technological innovations but also on societal betterment, with a distinctly human-centric approach. Mr Kapuria has committed an additional 2.5 crores for this new initiative.

Lastly, this 137th Prize Giving Ceremony also marks the introduction of a new award: the Kapuria Award for Innovation and Excellence, which was unveiled at the General Council meeting yesterday. This award will inspire students to strive for excellence and foster creativity, evoking the rich imagination of our fertile lands.

Mr Kapuria, we thank you greatly and welcome you back to your alma mater. May you remain connected with us always. Thank you.

Good afternoon, Your Highness, Maharaja Gaj Singh Ji of Jodhpur, President of the Mayo College General Council, members of the General Council, our chief guest Mr Deep Kapuria, members of the faculty, both present and past, dear parents, old boys, and, of course, most importantly, our very dear present boys.

Traditionally, when I begin my address, I recognize the various batches of Old Boys who have come, but this year I've noticed something: my present boys are far more resilient than some of the Old Boys here today. They have sat through the rain without flinching, while many of the spouses are still out there in the rain. But that softer generation of Old Boys, they've all run under the canopy of Bikaner Pavilion! Well, that's the first symbol of acknowledgment that the school is in better shape than it used to be.

Nonetheless, it is a matter of great pride for us that, traditionally, we invite the Golden and Silver Jubilee batches every year. This year, we've gone a step further by also inviting the Diamond Jubilee batch. Even if you are senior to me, would you kindly stand and be acknowledged? Please note that none of them has left their post. Thank you, sir—please sit down.



We also have the Golden Jubilee batch here in large numbers, and let's give them a big round of applause. Yesterday, some spouses told me something interesting: over the years, we've realized that when Mayoites get together, they only talk about Mayo, so we made our own WhatsApp group. I think the parents—especially the moms—understand how important a WhatsApp group is! But we also have the 40-year batch—1983. Do they have enough energy left to be counted? And of course, the 30-year batch of 1993 is here too. You can clearly see where the energy levels are. And I must say the Silver Jubilee batch looks quite "silvery."

So once again, I say: the closer you come to the current batches, the higher the energy levels, and the more the resilience. These are the two things we want all our children to leave school with: resilience and adaptability. And I'm proud to say that in today's times, it is evident. If you look around and see my batch of young graduates from Mayo—the batch of 2023—here to collect their prizes, it's clear that these qualities are alive and well.

But all these alumni who are here must remember that they were able to come through because they had parents—bold parents—who sent them to study in this fine institution. In the good old days, parents lost contact with their children from the time they joined the school until they returned home after the term. These days, children have a tough time keeping their parents

away, and many students have even asked me, "Sir, can't we cancel these PTMs?"

Let me tell you, every time your parents come, it gives us reassurance about whether we're doing the right things. We get feedback and try to correct ourselves. So, parents, you are one of the most important stakeholders. But remember, you've sent your child here to become independent and to do things on his own. And I think those of you who have been here for the last 48 hours—between the school play, the Exhibitions, Sports Day, and the Musical Night—have witnessed firsthand what your children are capable of. I request all the parents to give a big round of applause for your own children.

I've had many parents tell me, "Sir, we couldn't have done this when we were in school ourselves." So, boys, well done! Let's give a big round of applause to all of you.

We are proud of our 148-year tradition, and time will fly by before we commemorate our 150th year. We've set the ball rolling for this, and we hope that the celebration takes place not just in Ajmer, but across the country and globally. We look forward to alumni, parents, and others joining us in making this possible on the grandest scale.

At the same time, times have changed. While children continue to excel in various activities, marks still matter. Once they reach a certain level, they need to start studying and planning for the future. For those of you who have been around Alwar

House, you would have seen that we now have a robust career counseling program. While the kids are doing fine here, we are also preparing them for tomorrow by providing them with a wide range of career choices. Many of the options available to you in your time will eventually disappear, partly because the world is changing, and partly because AI is on the horizon. As you heard the President of the GC mention, our chief guest today will be a major catalyst in the transformation of our school into the AI age.

So, just as the President requested, may I also request you to give our chief guest a big round of applause!

I'm also happy to see that more and more Old Boys are coming to occupy their seats. By the time we give away the prizes and our chief guest speaks, Bikaner Pavilion will be packed once again. When we broadcast this on YouTube, we'll see a full house.

So, I request those of you who were weak at heart but strong in body to please come down and occupy your seats.

Once again, thank you very much for being here. I haven't told you all the wonderful things happening at the school, because as you can see, we have four very strapping young people standing behind me. They are my senior captains, and they will come and tell you from a student's perspective what's happening at the school and where we're headed. Once they finish, I'll be back shortly again.

Focused on the Under 14 teams, Mayo aims to expand its sports repertoire, with Volleyball on the horizon. Moving on, the thrill of adventure is evident at Mayo as treks in the Himalayas gain popularity, with nearly 100 students going for it last summer. With an evolving International Curriculum, longer durations for exchanges are now on the rise. I am one such example, as the pioneer of our Exchange initiated with King's Academy, Jordan, a Round Square Initiative.

Not everyone has the opportunity to be a part of an esteemed institution like Mayo College. As Mayoites, we consider ourselves fortunate and feel a responsibility to contribute to society and global causes. Our focus on addressing issues in a sustainable way reflects our commitment to society.

At Mayo, we adopt a unique approach, which involves implementing tech-based solutions to create micro impacts in our community. The positive outcome of our endeavours are evident around us, as well as at the international level. Soon, our boys will be embarking on a Collaborative International Social Service Project, while four others will be embarking on a Round Square International Service Project based in Thailand.

The introduction of soft skills at all levels with initiatives as the Gavel & Quill clubs, have helped elevate the threshold of communication skills for our students equipping them to be future ready.

Mayo feels like home more than home does itself, and this is only possible because of the 'Mayo Vibe' that we are made to feel a part of, where each one from the Housemasters to our dear farashes, is trained impeccably in 'Duty of Care', and in turn hone us to handle controlled adversity. We acknowledge the privilege and are dedicated to using it for the greater good.

On the academic front this year, We saw diverse talents emerge through Inter House plays in English and storytelling workshops in Hindi. Class 12 achieved remarkable results and placements, credited to the Higher Education Awareness Program (HEAP). Career guidance, now integral to the curriculum, led to three teachers becoming certified career counsellors in the past year. Hybrid coaching for entrance exams post-Class 10 has increased Class 11 enrollment, evidenced by a larger student body. The school is a SAT exam centre and plans for a PDQ Centre for the Cambridge Curriculum. Mayoites are embracing entrepreneurship in a big way, aiming to contribute to society by creating jobs rather than seeking one.

The alumni, with the Old Boy Lecture Series, are helping us take this theme further.

Being members of global organizations like Round Square and the International Boys School Coalition, along with Indian entities like Indian Public Schools Conference [IPSC], Boarding Schools Association of India [BSAI], SPICMACAY, and others, gives us enough room to explore diverse opportunities. We are proud to share our upcoming initiatives, where we will host the annual international conclave of SPICMACAY with more than 50 top artists performing, and the IPSC Principals' Conclave. We have evolved from 'doing' Round Square to 'being' a Round Square School. Our flagship event, the Mayo Middles Round Square Conference (the MMRSC) hosted each year by our young Grade 7 students, is globally appreciated - however, yet to be replicated.

Our Global exposure includes Conferences, Competitions and Exchange Programmes with Jordan, Kenya, Australia, the UAE, Bangladesh, Japan, South Africa, the UK, Germany and Thailand. The school also witnessed this year, the largest French and German language festivals yet. With high officials, including Ambassadors attending it, these events have gained immense popularity in India and overseas.

A steep rise in cultural events has led to the mushrooming of 30 clubs and societies for the 800 students - the highest number ever. A few highlights include the revival of the automobile society, 'Auto Mayo' established in 1996. We also have a Culinary Club in the making. The plethora of opportunities offered opens a vista for our students to explore and excel.

Your Highness Maharaja Gaj Singh Ji of Jodhpur, the President of the Mayo College General Council, members of the General Council, General Kulkarni, members of the faculty, and the Old Boys present here, especially the Diamond and Golden Jubilee batches, recipients of the JTM Gibson Award for Excellence, parents, and above all, dear boys of Mayo College, I'm deeply grateful for this rare privilege and honour, as an alumnus, to be the Chief Guest at the 139th Prize Giving.

Let me begin by congratulating all the prize winners, including the houses that have bagged various prizes. I do wish — and would have wished — that Jodhpur House had made it to the Udaipur Shield, though! That said, from where I stand, looking at all of you wonderful boys in your regal attire, especially the Junior School, for putting your best foot forward, you are all winners to me.

We all witnessed the live, excellent rendition of My Fair Lady and the music concert, and each and every one of you, whether on stage or off stage, was phenomenal. So, if today you didn't make it to the prize winners' list or didn't get a curtain call, still be proud. You visibly put in your very best with sincerity, and you're all, very certainly, winners. Don't let anyone tell you otherwise.

A word for the parents too: Please measure the success of your children by the qualities they imbibe — qualities such as fortitude, perseverance, devotion, and sincerity — rather than just their marks.

Boys, always remember, more important than winning or losing is the way you play the game. We saw that in polo last evening.

I learned this in my eight years in school, without fully realizing it. We imbibed respect for sportsmanship and fair play, and understood the value of teamwork. I was so happy to observe this in both the play and the musical concert, as well as in the sports events. It's clear that teamwork is thriving in our school, and I'm truly overwhelmed by the improvement I've seen.

I dare say that this emphasis on values, rather than just plain achievements, has always been an endearing quality of our school and sets a Mayoite apart from the rest. Besides these values that are an intrinsic part of the education at Mayo, another important aspect — as the Head Boy mentioned — is that there are no labels at Mayo. Labels don't matter here. You could come from any community, economic background, or part of the world, and it's irrelevant. Everyone is judged based on their merit, worth, and performance.



The years spent together here form the foundation of lifelong friendships and kinships that transcend space and time. I'm sure my friends from my batch, who are here to support me, as well as the others in the reunion, will echo this sentiment.

Like any other institution, Mayo has evolved over the years. And yes, I'll admit I'm biased, but I claim that the school has only become better with every challenge it has faced.

When I joined Mayo as an eight-year-old on a government scholarship in 1958, the school had just 325 students on a 450-acre campus. It was still finding its feet as a public school under the leadership of Mr JTM Gibson, whom many of us call Jack — or, as some of us like to call him behind his back, 'Gibby'.

While the character of the school was changing, much of the modern infrastructure you see today hadn't been put in place. The dining hall — which you probably now call the Senior Mess — was then known as the New Mess because it had just been commissioned. The Gibson Pool was still under construction, and I, along with many of my schoolmates (specifically the ones celebrating their Diamond Jubilee here today), helped dig it. This very Bikaner Pavilion, with the majestic Madar as a backdrop, has served as a venue for many activities. It wasn't only a cricket pavilion; it also served as an open-air cinema. We even used it for Gandhi Jayanti events and had a designated area where we could burst crackers on Diwali.

Since I left school in 1966 and visited many times in recent years, each visit has been an emotional and nostalgic experience. I marveled at how the school has kept pace with the times, adding new infrastructure — and some of it is still in the making. As Mayo prepares to celebrate its 150th year, I believe we, as Old Boys, as boys in school today, and as parents, need to acknowledge and celebrate that we are privileged to have attended this finest educational institution in the country, if not the world.

Before I delve into sharing my experiences, I'd like to make a small deal with the senior boys seated here: I don't wish to sermonize, but I'll share my experiences and you can listen with curiosity. Take mental notes, and consider what's in it for you. Are we all in agreement?

Most of us seniors, especially those who graduated before '69, have personal anecdotes with Gibby, as I would call him. Let me share two of mine that have left an

indelible mark on me.

I vividly remember Gibby emphasizing that here, at school, we were primarily here to learn — but learn what? We were here to learn how to think. That was empowering for me, and it should be empowering for any student, including the ones seated here today.

On a personal note, I'd like to share a life-defining memory. In middle school, we had to choose a hobby. In a moment of misguided enthusiasm, I decided I could be like Elvis Presley and chose to pursue music under the guidance of Mr Mahavalankar, our music teacher. However, my limited musical skills — and, let's say, my tone-deafness — became evident, and he sent me off to Gibby's office with a note.

I walked into Gibby's office with dread, fearing I'd receive the "best of three" or "best of six" treatment. But instead, Gibby looked at me, looked at the note, and without a word, wrote another note. He handed it to me, and I took it to Mr Verma, who supervised the metal workshop. Mr Verma opened the slip, laughed, and read the note aloud: "Give Deep a hammer and a piece of iron, and let him play all the music he can."

That, in a sense, is how I started with music — by banging hammers to forge steel. And here I am today: still not a musician, but working with steel, shaping it into precision powertrains, gears, and transmissions, both in India and abroad, supplying to the most reputed global brands.

Beyond Mr Gibson, I must also acknowledge the profound influence two of my other teachers had on me: Mr T.D. Pant, whom we called Gurudev, and Mr Ramesha, a gifted cricketer who played for Rajasthan in the Ranjit Trophy.

Gurudev taught us Sanskrit and conducted the morning temple service before PT. We would sit on the floor with safas on our heads and black Jodhpur coats, sweating as we listened to him teach us stories from the epics and explain shlokas in great detail. His teachings subtly instilled values and ethics in all of us. The mantra we recited at the beginning of each assembly is now a part of our corporate philosophy, displayed at the entrance of all our facilities.

Mr Ramesha taught math with such logic and dedication that I developed a deep love for the subject. Reflecting on it now, I realize how math gave me the foundation for problem-solving skills, which later helped me in my engineering studies and eventually led to a full scholarship for postgraduate studies at MIT.

However, I was drawn back to India before finishing the first semester. My ambition was to become a self-made entrepreneur, manufacturing precision tools that weren't available in India. The entrepreneurial path wasn't without its challenges, but I remained resilient, always focused on innovation. Today, our group companies are recognized not just for their products but for their ethical governance.

As I look back, I realize that what kept me going was the resilience instilled in me right here, during my school days. The spirit of picking yourself up and moving forward, no matter what. This resilience, I believe, is something you'll carry with you.

So let me underscore three points from my life's journey:

1. Academics alone won't prepare you for what awaits you outside these walls. Emotional resilience and self-belief are equally important. When we had compulsory boxing in our day, Gibby's motto was: "Stand up, take it on the chin, and keep going."
2. Don't be afraid to fail. Failure is part of life. In our industry, we design experiments specifically to fail, because small failures lead to breakthroughs.
3. During life's darkest moments, rely on your values and ethos to guide you, even when the way forward seems unclear.

As you step out into the world, remember that technology is driving change at an exponential rate, and AI is at the forefront of this revolution. But as the world embraces AI, we must also remember to apply ethical considerations. AI systems, like those used in autonomous vehicles, raise profound ethical questions that can only be answered by a strong value system.

At Mayo, we are committed to ensuring that our students are prepared for the future. We're working on establishing a Human-Centric Center of Excellence for Robotics and AI, which we hope to inaugurate on the school's 150th anniversary.

So, let's commit to making our school future-ready. The school provides the opportunities, but it's your responsibility to seize them. You will lead the world of tomorrow.

Go, go out there and conquer the future. Go Mayo! Boys, let's shout it one more time, with the spirit of warriors. Go Mayo!

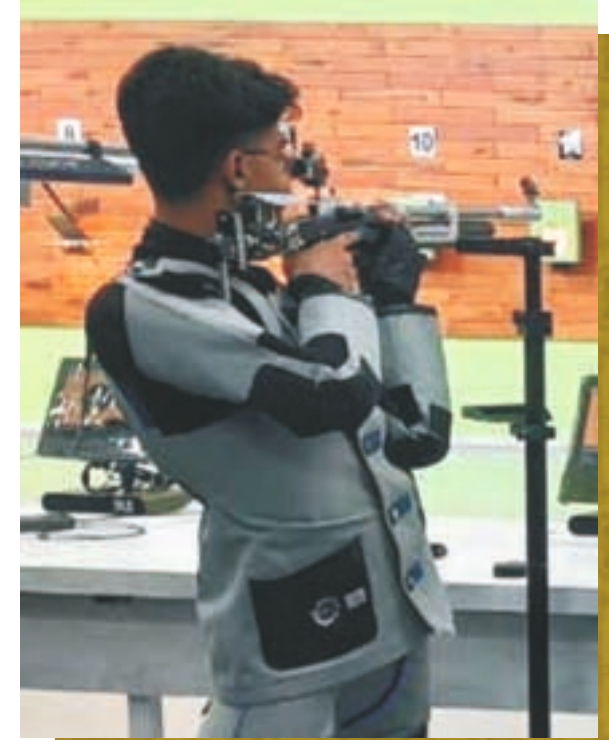

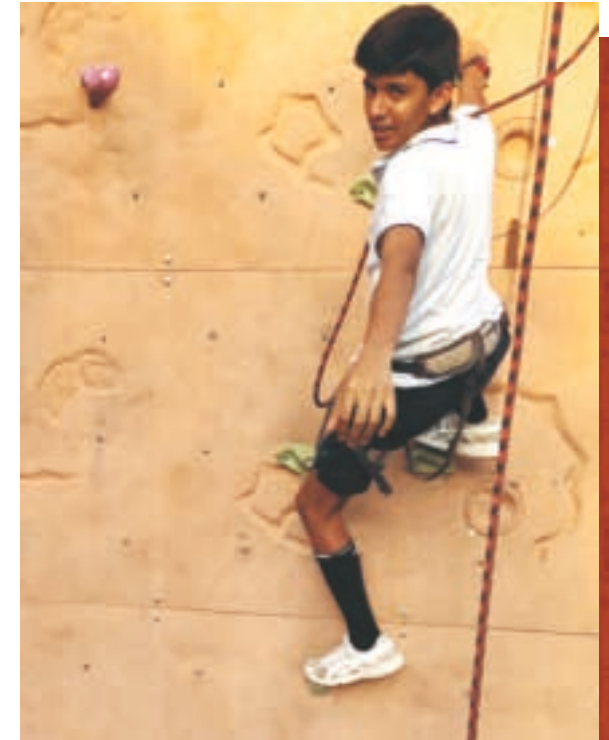

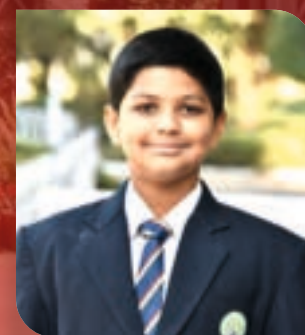

COLLEGE APPLICATION OVERVIEW

More than 1,200 college applications were made in the last two years to 15+ countries, and approximately 40 crores (INR) in scholarships were offered to our students by universities. Our students have been admitted to prestigious universities across the world from Ivy League Institutions like Cornell and Brown University to University College and King's College in London, University of Sydney and University of Melbourne in Australia, The University of Toronto and

University of British Columbia in Canada and Ashoka and Delhi University in India. HEAP maintains a hectic annual calendar that is jam-packed with informative sessions, reflective activities and skills enhancing workshops. We bring our accomplished alumni, university professors and experts from all over the world to meet our students and provide them insights into the evolving world of Colleges and Careers.

The purpose of the program is not only to make college applications but to ensure that our students are well informed and make choices that are 'best fit' for them. In the last two years our alumni have not only transitioned into prestigious colleges but have excelled there as is evidenced in several of them featuring on the Dean's Lists, heading student organizations and winning prestigious awards and internships.



MAYO MODEL G20 SUMMIT

The First Edition of the Mayo Model G20 Summit, themed "Let There Be Light & वसुधैव कुटुम्बकम्," brought together brilliant minds from leading institutions across India to address pressing global political, social, and economic issues. Amogh Javali served as Chairman, with Apoorv Agarwal holding the position of Chief Coordinator of the Summit. Participants engaged in high-level discussions, negotiations, and problem-solving exercises, mirroring the actual G20 Summit. This platform allowed students to develop collaborative diplomacy skills and learn about global governance. The Summit culminated in the 10-page 'Mayo Declaration' reflecting the delegates' 100% consensus on key global issues. The declaration was reviewed by the G20 Sherpa of India, Mr Amitabh Kant. The event was further distinguished by Mr Manish Chand and Mr Gurjit Singh, who offered invaluable insights on diplomacy and leadership during the opening and closing ceremonies, respectively.

Rahil: Schools are often defined by the enduring ethos they cultivate over generations. However, shifts in societal attitudes can impact these traditions. How do you perceive these changes, and what is your strategy for preserving or evolving the school's ethos?

Sir: I think it's essential to understand the difference between tradition and ritual. A tradition is timeless and should continue, but the way it manifests will evolve with changing societal norms. For example, leadership is a tradition here, but its meaning has evolved over time. A century ago, leaders were seen as authoritative figures; today, concepts like "first among equals" and "servant leadership" have emerged. While Mayo still values traditions like courage, honor, and leadership, we now emphasize empathy, compassion, and social service. These qualities are essential for preparing future leaders. Holding onto outdated philosophies would make our students ineffective leaders in the modern world.

Rahil: In your opinion, what has been the most enduring strength of the school, and how does that shape its future direction?

Sir: Although I haven't been here long, I've noticed a unique sense of belonging to Mayo College. The bond among students and alumni is admirable. Interacting with alumni, I'm impressed by their desire to contribute to the school, rather than taking from it. This pride and loyalty are evident in the way our old boys and current students prioritize the school's reputation. This loyalty, along with Mayo's enduring balance of Western philosophy and Indian culture, has shaped strong character in our students, contributing to their success in life.



Rahil: How do you balance upholding the school's traditions with your vision for its future development?

Sir: It's a misconception that tradition and vision are mutually exclusive. My vision is to continue our glorious legacy, adapting to changing contexts. Mayo has been a top school for 150 years, and I want to ensure it remains so for the next 50. This doesn't mean changing traditions but refining elements that no longer serve us. For example, if bullying was once accepted, it isn't anymore. Teachers also can't use the same disciplinary methods as 20 years ago. The goal remains the same; only the methods evolve.

Rahil: What do you find most rewarding about working with students in a boarding school environment, and how does that influence your daily approach?*

Sir: I thoroughly enjoy every aspect of my job. I'm fortunate to wake up each day looking forward to work. While there are moments of frustration and doubt, the privilege of shaping even a few students' futures is immensely rewarding. Success will be judged in the future, but for now, I find fulfillment in making life better for students daily.

Rahil: If you could implement one bold, transformative initiative for the future of the school, what would it be and why? Also, if the school had a time capsule, what quirky item from today would you add as a surprise for future students?

Sir: If I revealed that, it wouldn't be much of a surprise, would it? You'll have to wait 50 years, by which time I'll be long gone and you'll be a grandfather. Then you can open the time capsule and see for yourself.
